
PREMILLENNIALISM EXPOSED

Lesson One: THE RUPTURE OF THE RAPTURE

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Pre-millennialism is the doctrine that Christ will rapture (call up) his saints to heaven for a period of time and then return to the city of Jerusalem to reign as an earthly king for one thousand years before judging the world and taking the saints to heaven for eternity.

Scriptures:

1 Thessalonians 4:13-18

Pre-millennial Belief Concerning this Passage: The word rapture comes from the Latin translation of the words found in 1 Thessalonians 4:17 (caught up). The doctrine of the rapture is that there will be two resurrections. One in which the faithful saints will secretly disappear and later return with Christ for a thousand year reign. The other resurrection will be of the wicked after the thousand year reign has been completed.

Revelation 20:1-6

Pre-millennial Belief Concerning this Passage: The thousand years in this passage is a literal period of time that Christ will reign as king. It refers to the time after the tribulation that Christ will reign on earth as a king in the City of Jerusalem. At the end of that time, the battle of Armageddon will be fought, the wicked will be raised and judged and the righteous will go to heaven.

ote the teaching of this passage:
evelation is a book written in, Revelation 1:1-2
he term 1,000 is used in Revelation over twenty times, always as a symbol of, not as a number to be taken literally.
evelation 20:1-6 is written in contrast to Revelation 6:9-11 to show the vindication of those who keep their in Christ.

Paul makes clear that faith trumps flesh in regards to God's promise.

Paul makes note of God's Remnant promise to Israel

Romans 11:25 cannot mean that the entire nation of Israel will be saved, but instead refers to the salvation of a remnant who are truly faithful to God.

Pre-millennialism is the doctrine that Christ will establish an earthly kingdom in the city of Jerusalem. Christ intended to establish it during his first coming (Matthew 4:17) but was postponed because of rejection. Therefore Christ will wait to establish the kingdom until he returns.

The Double Mountain Theory states that the Old Testament prophets and the people of Jesus' day did not recognize the Church because they were looking forward to the Kingdom. The church operates as a 'stop gap' method of salvation until Christ will return to establish his true Kingdom.

Pre-millennial view: Christ desires an earthly kingdom based in Jerusalem. Since he could not establish this kingdom his first time, he will establish it when he returns.
