2 Sam 5: Became King, Conquers Jerusalem, Defeats Philistines 1st real conversation with kid is at his death We spend our time chasing what's not important What purpose is a kingdom if you can't pass it on

III. Pursued Pleasure Over Responsibility

Bathsheba, 2 Samuel 11:1-2

Kings go out to war, Bathsheba preg/call Uriah home, mobile, have him killed, Finally Nathan steps in

Eph. 5 Provide for her, "nourish" Protect her, "cherish"

Discipline her, "cleanse spot, wrinkle" Rev. 3:19

know/honor her, 1 Pet. 3:7

Be a helper to your husband Respect your husband

IV. He Loved But Didn't Discipline

Amnon 2 Sam 13:21, 25, He was furious, did nothing Absalom, rebelled, almost died, "Don't kill him"

V. He Raised Kids Just Like Him

Was not clear about succession: 1 Kings 1 (Adonijah) Solomon had some characteristics: asks for wisdom 1 King 3 Builds temple

Also bad with women, also susceptible to passions Rehoboam: Maakah (2 Chron. 11:21 18 wives, 60)

Daughter of Absolom: mother, grandmother, idolatry
